
#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

# The Etiquette of Tennis

#### Point 4 - Ball Calling

- (i) In matches without an umpire, it is your obligation to call balls at your end to help your opponent make calls if requested, and to call against yourself any ball that you clearly see out on your opponent's side of the net.
- (ii) If a ball is not good, you should call clearly and promptly (i.e. before either your opponent has hit the return or your own return has gone out of play).

If in doubt, you should make no call and should play the ball as good. Repeated Non-observance of this is likely to be regarded by your opponent as cheating.

- (iii) In the rare circumstances that you and your opponent agree that neither of you was in a position to judge and call a ball, then a let should be played.
- <u>Point 9</u> Return balls directly to the person serving, preferably under the net.

Unless there is an element of doubt on a service call necessitating the playing of a stroke, <u>refrain from hitting</u> service faults.
