PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The stormy conditions in September are now behind us and we look forward to some pleasant spring weather as we get under way for the coming 1991/92 tennis season. Time to dust off your racquet and try on your new tennis shoes!

Over the winter months there have been a number of significant changes to the club facilities and mode of operations.

Firstly the rebuilding of courts 6 to 8 is proceeding well and weather permitting should be in action sooner than we achieved with the Courts in the 13 - 17 bay.

Another major change has been the adoption of the new Constitution and subsequent to that the appointment of the newly structured Board of Management to run the clubs affairs. We have held our first meeting and are currently reviewing the capital improvements to the clubs facilities during this year. Accurate prices are being obtained for replacing the Groundsman's Shed, the construction of a Bumper Board off one wall of the new shed and a general tidying up and improvement of that eye-sore section of the club.

The Club has purchased it's own computer for Club Membership records, Administration and Financial Control as well as to assist in organising social sets on the weekends. Naturally there will be a period of experimentation and a few hiccups as we learn to operate the programme efficiently. The computer has been introduced as a means of providing better set management




CLUB SHIRTS & TRACK SUIT TOPS FOR SALE

FINANCES

Funds on hand at 30 September were \$45,358. Although many subscriptions have been paid we ask those with outstanding to quickly finalise these with any one of our three financial "receivers" - namely Geoff Groves, Graeme Rundle or Bob Howman. Capital works planned for this year include the new Gardeners shed \$30,000 and the re-turfing of the remaining bay (\$20,000) should eable to be financed uder our cash flow projections for the year.

GROUNDS REPORT:

The newly grassed bay is making good progress and is further advanced than the 13-17 courts were at this time last year. Fertilizing, extra watering and a light top dressing will be undertaken as necessary to bring them into play at the earliest opportunity.

Supergrasse of Sydney will send a representative to inspect our courts on his next visit to Perth in December to discuss our difficulties with the excess sand. Discussions are also taking place with a second distributor of these courts in WA, where hopefully we will obtain better service than we have from Sportsland. Fortnightly sweeping of the courts is being arranged and rest assured much effort is being made to correct the problem.

Tenders have been received for the building of a new groundsman's shed and attached bumping board area, and this should proceed shortly.

CONSTITUTION

A well attended general meeting was held on 30 July to debate the proposed revised Club Constitution. A sub-committee comprising Alec Whyte, Kathy Cook & Dene Rundle prepared several drafts and these were considered and amended in places by the outgoing committee. The new Constitution was prepared basically for three reasons:

(1) to make it member friendly in terms of sequence and wording

(2) to bring our Constitution into line with the legal requirements of the Liquor Licensing Division and the Associations Incorporation Act (1987)

(3) to introduce a different management structure for the Club in which each division of the Club was represented on the Board

The motion was introduced by Dene Rundle who outlined the nature of the changes. A series of questions followed after which the motion was put and agreed to by those present.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Eighty five people attended this years AGM, possibly a record for the club. The Monday evening may have been more suitable than the Friday time-slot previously used, and there was also the newly constituted Board of Management to be elected. Whatever the reason it was great to see such a large cross section showing an interest in the affairs of the club. The meeting initially heard an impressive series of reports on the year just ended from Secretary Auriol Heary, Treasurer Bob Howman and President Alec Whyte.

The key feature of the year was the re-turfing of eight of the twelve grass courts with the new wintergreen variety, five of which were planted in July of last year and have been in use since February of this year. Courts 6 to 8 were planted in May and appear to have established their root systems in readiness for the spring warmth and growing season.

It was a healthy sign for the club when a number of ballots were required to determine various positions, and the final composition of the inaugural Board of Management is as follows:

TENNIS COACHING TIP-

by Club Coach - Keith Begley

MISCONCEPTIONS ABOUT POWER !

Many people come to me for lessons and want more power.. In fact they really mean they want to hit hard and keep the ball in the court. Power in tennis can never be divorced from the other Ball Control Objectives of Height, Direction, Distance and Spin. Factors controlling Power are as follows:

- 1. Racquet Velocity
- 2. Distance of the Backswing
- 3. Angular and Linear Force
- 4. Ideal Biomechanical Sequence
- Speed of the oncoming ball
- 6. Racquet and Court Material

Since consistency is the most important factor in strategy, power should be used when you are well set up and in good position. Remember the faster your racquet is travelling the harder it is to adjust and time all the proper racquet paths and angles needed for control. Only when there is an opportunity to attack or force should power be used to put away the point or give the opponent a challenge to their timing. Don't fall into the trap of equating hitting hard with winning. One can hit very hard and just be an impressive loser. Make sure you are aware of the line between stroking hard while in control and hitting hard and losing control. It varies for every individual and changes as you get better. STROKE WITHIN YOUR LIMITS.
