

HENSMAN'S PROMISING JUNIORS

A number of Hensman youngsters have made their present felt in State and National tennis circles during 1991/92.

SIOBHAN DRAKE-BROCKMAN heads the list with a win in her age group of the Australian Junior Masters tournament at Adelaide earlier in the season, followed by a closr runner-up performance in the 14 years and under National Championships held at Brisbane in January.

MONIKA SEKULOV is a team-mate of Siobhan in our Mazda City State League team, and her performances are not far behind. She took out 4th placing in the same events at Adelaide and Brisbane and teamed with Siobhan to win the National 14 years Doubles title at the latter venue.

Amongst the boys, PAUL ST QUENTIN, LUCA D'ORSOGNA and MARK WIL-LIAMS have all featured prominently in the WA scene. At the recent City of Melville Masters Choc Milk Championships, Paul edged out Luca in 3 sets to win the 13 years singles title, then combined with Mark to capture the 14 years doubles crown.



GROUNDS

The new storage and groundsman's shed is nearing completion, together with the hit up wall. The nets and other items will be kept in the storage section and it is also proposed to have a tool kit here to enable emergency repairs to be undertaken on weekends. It is possible some members have surplus old tools which may be suitable for this kit, and if you wish to help please contact Garry Napier, who has a list of what is needed. The Groundsman's section is to be kept locked and not accessible to members.

The hit-up wall is already being used and we encourage members to iron out their weak spots and generally get into the groove by taking advantage of this new facility at the club. The concrete floor is to be painted. The children's play area has been relocated and once the tin storage shed is removed the barbecue area should once again be a pleasant spot for outdoor events.

The new bay of courts (6 - 8) are progressing well and will be appreciated in this second half of the season. Courts 9 - 12 are experiencing the same sort of difficulties of earlier years, and a proposal will be put to members in March or April for the replacement of this bay of courts.

Efforts continue to find ways to improve the watering coverage from our reticulation systems. Further representatives from the Super-Grasse companies have inspected our courts and their report is expected shortly.

All of the globes have been replaced on the environmental lights that surround the syn thetic courts. These globes will receive an annual cleaning to improve and extend their performance. The new colorbond roof on the clubhouse is now settled in, having withstood the recent heavy rains!

Landscaping with low maintenance shrubs etc is being considered to enhance the appearance of the club, particularly the new area surrounding the new shed.
