PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

We are now well into 1996 and things seem to be running reasonably smoothly. Good numbers continue at social tennis. It is worth noting that Hensman Park is one of the few clubs enjoying social tennis on Sundays. We appreciate the faithful who keep the number up.

Important teams are having their share of success. I am sure plenty will represent the club in finals - Good luck and good tennis.

The State Grade recent win over top side Kings Park was a great team effort and rewarding result. The boys have shown what they can achieve. Hopefully they will make the finals and continue their winning form.

As most are aware we need funds to maintain our State grade account (and team). Please support the State grade functions and fund raisers wherever possible. The Champagne Breakfast was a great success. Congratulations to all helpers. Colin's "egg destruction" and Ashley's "sausage cremation" left little to be desired.

We have all had some concern with the condition of the lawn courts. Thankfully they are now improving rapidly. I can assure all members that the grounds committee and staff put in a lot of physical and mental effort. The winter grass is not without its problems. As one of the first clubs with it, we are the first to experience these, and to some extent, pioneering the solutions. The grounds committee welcomes, listens to and considers constructive criticism. It is, however, not feasible to follow all (sometimes conflicting) advice.

We are experiencing considerable increase in costs of maintaining the grass courts, hall and surround, and providing adequate facilities (eg teas and provisions, toilet provision, refrigeration, hall cleaning, creche) to the standard expected. We are monitoring the situation. It is possible that we will need a reasonable increase in fees and/or change in fee structure next year.

Still await the outcome of our substantial grant application for building improvements (expected late in February). Further financial "planning" of our contribution and decision on timing and extent of building depends to a great degree on this outcome.

Club Championships are approaching. Events exist for all. Don't be hesitant in entering and enjoying the friendly rivalry.
