CAPTAIN'S CORNER

Just over ninety members nominated to play in our weekend pennant teams for the coming season. An unusually high number of twenty-three new members indicated their willingness to participate if chosen. A total of sixteen teams were selected from the nominations.

It is hoped they will do credit to the club both in terms of sportsmanship and quality of tennis.

Tennis West took the unusual step of allocating teams to divisions of the competition before club's had submitted their teams. The philosophy behind this initiative is to put the onus back onto the club's to correctly nominate teams to the various divisions, rather than Tennis West facing the daunting task of grading teams given that some club's forward very little information to assist with team grading. Although we were happy with the divisions given to most teams, we have put forward a number of submissions to change the division nominated on the basis of players available. In one case we are hoping for one team to be raised five divisions.

Although teams have been submitted, they are considered provisional, as due to the large number of new players and exciting group of young, fast developing juniors, many challenge matches still have to be played, after which team composition can be finalised.

There will be one State League match, either mens or ladies, played on Hensman grass courts each Saturday. Other teams will use either the synthetic courts at the club or at Wesley College. Sunday teams will play on some grass and some synthetic courts at Hensman, as well as having two grass courts at Nedlands Tennix Club for our "home" venue.

Midweek ladies teams have been selected by Isla Green and Joan Campbell.


This is little changed from last year, but it is good to see that Keith is fit and available as a regular member of the 1993-94 team.

INTERESTED IN WEEKNIGHT COMPETITIONS




MIDWEEK LADIES PENNANTS

SYNTHETIC COURT AVAILABILITY INFORMATION

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR CLUB MEMBERS

The following information is provided for the benefit of members to understand the pertinent points which directly affect them with respect to the synthetic court , club coach & court hire arrangements.

MEMBERS COURT TIME FROM 01 OCT. TO 31 MAY

SATURDAY	5 COURTS	12.30PM to 6.30PM
SUNDAY	4 COURTS	12.30PM to 6.30PM
SUNDAY	5 COURTS	2.00PM to 6.30PM
ON - FRI INCL.	3 COURTS	3.30PM to 6.30PM

The coach may hire out synthetic courts during club designated time on weekdays provided the courts are not being used by club members. When club members wish to play on the hired courts then it is the responsibility of the coach or his employee to ensure the hirers vacate the court immediately.

Club members may use the synthetic courts not occupied due to outside hiring, or coaching between 6.30am and 6.30pm free of charge.

Should members bring a visitor to play on the synthetic courts during the court hire period (ie; other than times indicated above) a fee of \$4.00/hour per visitor or the court hire fee, whichever is the lesser, is payable.

Members shall book and pay the agreed court hire fee for court use after 6.30pm on any day.

Members should book and pay \$4.00/hour per court when using lights (if required) before 6.30pm on any day.

Members are responsible to ensure that any visitors they bring to the club during club time (as detailed above) pay the required visitors fee , sign the visitors register (located adjacent to the kitchen servery) and deposit the visitors fee in an envelope and deposit it in the box provided.

Shoe tags must be worn at all times as proof of membership and must be produced to the coach or any of his attendants if requested. Failure to produce your shoe tag may result in your having to pay court hire fees if proof of membership can not be substatiated to the pro-shop staff.

South Perth City Council requirements are that court use is restricted to between the hours of 6.30am to 10.30pm.

TENNIS ATTIRE

The following are the Tennis West guidelines on recognized tennis attire. These guidelines are an expectation not a request.

GENERAL STATEMENT

All clothing must designed and manufactured as tennis clothing and must be clean and tidy in order to maintain an appropriate standard of dress and decorum.

MALES

Recognized, acceptable tennis shorts and shirts (colours permitted), white or cream trousers, cardigans, jumpers, pullovers. Shirts must have a collar.

FEMALES

Recognized, acceptable tennis dresses, skirts (divided or otherwise) and tops, shorts, cardigans, jumpers, pullovers.

TRACKSUITS

Tracksuits, leisure suit slacks or similar garments (colour or white) may be worn over tennis attire immediately before play. Tracksuit pants may be worn during the hit up only. a tracksuit may only be worn as an adjunct to (not a substitute for) normal tennis attire. During cold weather and subject to the consent of an appropriate official, tracksuits may be worn during play.

FOOTWEAR

Must be designed and manufactured as tennis shoes appropriate for the surface pertinent to the particular event in which the player is competing.

UNACCEPTABLE ATTIRE NOT PERMITTED
UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES AND
APPLICABLE TO BOTH MALE AND FEMALE
PLAYERS.

CLOTHING AND FOOTWEAR

No sleeveless singlets, T-shirts, rugby tops, sweat tops, tank tops, and street attire.

No football, running or jogging, cycling, board, bermuda, boxer or walk shorts, swimwear, leotards, aerobic gear, stretch clothing, or body shorts worn under tennis shorts, leg warmers.

No ripple sole, jogging, running, cricket shoes or shoes with raised heels or studs.

ADVERTISING

No bold lettering, writing or illustration designed as advertising or blatantly excessive and oversize commercial advertising.

It is the duty of every members to comply with these dress requirements so as to present a good image of the Hensman Park Tennis Club to the public.

Please assist the management committee by adhering to these guidelines.

GROUND'S

Groundsman Craig Ellis, with Kevin Fitzgerald and his team continue to do a fine job with the courts and clubhouse surrounds. We still require some good growing weather before optimum court conditions can be achieved, so we need to be aware and responsible with court usage.

To sist please follow these simple guidelines:

- * obey NO PLAY signs when erected
- * no play on grass courts before 9 am at anytime
- *avoid using the courts where wear is evident
- * don't always go to the closest court, walk a bit further to share the wear between all the courts
- * wear proper footwear at all times
- * report any abuse of these guidelines and rules as per noticeboard to any Board member for action

If we ALL follow these points, the better the court condition (and hence availability!) will be.

HALL FOR HIRE

The club's hall is available for hire. For one-off functions it is a condition of hire that a club member must be closely associated with the function. The rate is \$15hour (min. \$30). Recent examples are the Southern Districts Gaelic Football Club (of which Alister Boyes & Ian Rundle are members) quiz night and Bill Artingstall's Davis Travel, for a travel seminar presentation evening . Permanent hire arrangements (for which no club association is required) are also available. For hall enquiries contact Garry Napier or Geoff Groves.
