





FROM THE TREASURER

The club commenced this financial year with \(\cdot \) \$49,004 funds, after another successful financial year in which an operating profit of \$30,402 was earned. Contributing to this excellent result was the profit (before electricity) from the Bar and drinks machine of \$7260, Social Committee \$4036, Sponsorship \$4407 and Interest \$9499. A copy of the annual financial report is available at the clubhouse. The investment with Benwood Finance amounting to \$11,292 is in doubt as this Company is in receivership. The expected dividend should be known in the coming months but provision for the loss of this investment was made in the Accounts. The club has had funds invested with Benwood for several years and it has been listed in our investments in the annual Treasurer's report each year. Last year also saw a large expenditure on capital improvements to the club and these totalled \$46.692. \$26,000 on renovations to the hall, \$6,900 a reticulation, \$2,700 Security system, \$2,600 glasswasher, \$2,700 kitchen and bar floor and \$3.400 on furniture were the main items. The club continues in a sound financial position and for this we are indebted to our fine treasurer, Bob Howman.

NON PLAYING MEMBERSHIP

In line with other sporting clubs, leave of absence has been discontinued - however members who are unable to play any season for various reasons may apply to be transferred temporarily to the "non playing" category. The cost this year is \$10. These members will continue on the mailing list and will receive copies of the Herald.


