

VISITORS & PROSPECTIVE NEW MEMBERS

With the growth of our club has come the need to introduce new procedures for the nomination and processing of applications for membership. The Membership Committee comprises Alec Whyte, Bill Artingstall, Elsie Carroll and June Rundle and you should consult one of them should you wish to propose a new member.

Nomination forms will no longer be handed direct to applicants - they are available from a member of the membership committee and will only be handed to the proposer. It is important that a proposer knows the person they are nominating, and also that they know the standard of the person's tennis and their ability to fit into a social tennis environment.

People visiting the club and who are unknown to anyone will have their application handled by the membership committee. Any person whose standard is not known may be required to attend an "introductory session" during which the membership committee will verify that the applicant knows the rules of tennis, plays tennis of a standard satisfactory to our club and is a person suitable for admission to the club.

Although our membership numbers are at record levels we are able to offer "restricted membership" at any time, and the new member is able to play at all times except Saturday afternoons. As soon as numbers permit the membership category is transferrred to full membership. This is important as we do not want to turn members away and it has been brought to our attention that a number of people have joined elsewhere as they heard Hensman was "full" !

VALE KEN PITCHER

Ken's sudden and tragic death recently shocked his many friends at Hensman. Though not a regular participant in more recent years, he enjoyed a distinguished membership with the club spanning a period of 40 years. Ken joined while still a student at Perth Modern School and quickly made his mark as a junior competitor, narrowly missing Linton Cup selection in 1952. At that time he and his regular partner, Basil Stone, held the State No 2 ranking for the Junior Doubles.

After completing his teacher training he spent a short period in the country before returning to his parent's Anstey St home and resuming his tennis career at Hensman Park. During the next 25 years or so Ken established himself as a highly competitive and effective pennant player at Men's A Reserve and, later, Veterans level. In 1977 he was a member of the vistorious 1st Division Veteran team. His playing successes also extended to the club championships arena; he won the Mens singles in 1967, the Mens doubles in 1966 and 1967 and the Mixed Doubles in 1971.

Apart from his tennis ability, Ken was also well renowned for his loyal and enthusiastic support for the Hensman Park Tennis Club and served for a time as Club Secretary. Above all he was a generous, friendly, likeable person who won the respect and affection of his fellow members. He will be sadly missed.

In the 60s tennis was in the doldrums at Hensman and most other clubs, and Noreen & John were both actively involved in running Spring and City of Perth tournaments at the Club - John in the match box and Noreen generally in the kitchen.

John was born in Boulder and was School captain of Eastern Goldfields High School before moving to the city to study at UWA. He captained the WA Amateur Football team in the 1956 Hobart carnival, and played pennant squash for many years. His work has been mainly in the personnel and industrial relations field with the W.A. Employers Federation, P.A. Management Consultants and Chamberlains before his retirement two years ago. John has been runner up in the singles on four occasions but has won the Club doubles a total of four times - these days he is one of our keenest members of the Veterans team. John has held most positions in the club including President, Captain, Secretary, Treasurer, Bar Manager and recently Publicity Officer

Hensman occupies a special place in the lives of John and Noreen and they recall not only the old hedge that surrounded the courts but the strength of the nucleus of dedicated members of the club who helped to carry it through the lean times into what is now a boom period for the club. They are as proud to be a part of Hensman as we are to have them as Life members.
