HARDCOURTS TO BE LOCKED

After discussions with Tennis Success the Board of Management has agreed to a two month trial period for the Hard Courts to be locked whenever either the Tennis Success shop or Club Office are not open. This is to prevent unauthorised use of the courts by non members not paying court hire and to prevent vandalism to the courts. The Tennis Success shop has been broken into twice during recent months and several instances of rubbish being spread over the courts have occurred. Other tennis courts in the vicinity are also now being locked for similar reasons.

A system will be devised so that members wishing to use the hardcourts will not be disadvantaged. A combination lock will be installed on one gate and all members will be advised of the combination. Non members will need to obtain a key from a nearby Deli and pay the hire fee and key deposit.

GROUNDS AND HALL

We have had to close the middle bay of the grass courts to enable renovation and levelling of the surface to occur. I am certain you are all well aware of how uneven the bounce was and drastic steps had to be taken. This has been due to a combination of extensive spread of Spring Dead Spot, thatching and insufficient time before Opening Day to do the present top dressing.

Hopefully, when the number of players are at their lowest in December and January and with no Pennant demands we can also renovate courts 6,7 & 8 so that we can all enjoy good grass courts again!!!

I fell that our new groundsman Fred Maartensz of Turf Care WA has a good grasp of the requirements of our Winter Green grass but he feels we will need to look at our policy of continuous play during the winter months. It does not allow enough time for adequate court preparation before Opening Day.

Winter Green grass has two major problems - it thatches up and becomes water resistant very quickly and it is very susceptible to Spring Dead Spot. We need to look at strategies to overcome these problems otherwise we will always have inferior courts or need to plant a different disease resistant grass.

My best wishes to you all for Christmas and hopefully we will have much better courts for you to play on in 1999!!
