

CLUB IMPROVEMENTS

FINANCE REPORT - 1986/87 SEASON

Bob Howman was all smiles as he presented his report at the AGM, and well he might be as this was undoubtedly the best financial result enjoyed by our club since it was formed 62 years ago. The operating profit of \$25068 compared to \$15684 the previous year. There was capital expenditure of \$52051 during the year (45225 for our share of the synthetic courts, the balance being other costs associated with the hall and furniture). The prepaid Memberships of \$11835 and Interest Bearing Debentures of \$8700 are virtually covered by Invested club funds.

Some of the highlights from his report were:

- * Subs and Nomination fees \$3609 (up \$5,500)
- *Bar and Kitchen profit \$5324 [up \$1,900]
- * Greenkeepers Fees and Court Maintenance \$12218 down \$4300)

The books were again audited by Harvey Pickup, for which the club is very grateful. Congratulations to Bob Howman on another year of careful and efficient handling of the Clubs finances. *

YOU'RE ONLY AS GOOD AS YOUR SECOND SERVE

HE title to this article is one of the game's truisms. Some otherwise very good players are limited by the weakness of their second serve. Conversely, a strong second serve may be the ingredient that turns a good player into a champion.

Take note of the second serve of players such as Ivan Lendl, Stefan Edberg, Boris Becker and John McEnroe. You will realise how important

a weapon it is in their armory.

In view of all this, it's surprising that players – ranging from the average club player to the well-seasoned circuit pro – do not practise the second serve enough. The fact is, this shot is not only of great value in singles but in doubles as well. In doubles, once you do develop a good kick serve, you can use it very effectively on occasions as your *first* serve.

What do we try to achieve with a second serve?

Basically, control – plus the capacity to put our opponent in as much difficulty as possible in returning the ball.

If you simply hit a flat second serve, your opponent is presented with an easy-pace ball bouncing just about waist-high. The ball will come through nicely and he can attack it. Also, since a flat second serve must be hit fairly low over the net, the more you add pace to the ball, the more you risk serving a double-fault.

With a good kick serve, you gain control and consistency. You're able to hit the ball higher over the net, and because of the spin which you impart, it will drop much more sharply.

Since the ball isn't coming through flat, it will be harder to return and will place your opponent under greater pressure. A kicker to a right-hander's backhand – especially in the backhand court – is a particularly well-proved tactic. A player has less reach on the backhand side, so that a ball kicking wide may move him out of court. Even if he makes a return, you have opened up the court.

Before I deal with the detail of serving a kicker, try to get an image in your mind of what you are attempting. You are attempting to hit under-and-over the ball to impart topspin and sidespin. It's a very physical shot. You must bend the knees, arch the back and launch yourself into the ball – up...up...off the ground with your feet... and under-and-over the ball. After striking the ball, you land in the court, with enough momentum to play a positive next shot, either from the back court or on your way to the net.

This is all tough on your body. But tennis – like life – wasn't meant to be easy!
