

FINANCES -

Treasurer Bob Howman has a grin that gets wider each year he presents his annual report to members. surplus this year of \$43,023 (1988 \$37,4485) is the result of a growing club membership, many club activities and also a very efficient Treasurer. The net income from Social activities was \$2,010, the Bar and Drink Machine netted \$7,260 and the Sponsorship committee weighed in with \$4,368. Capital expenditure for the year was \$5,474, however a very large programme of capital works commenced in July and this will take care of much of the gains of the last two years. The reticulation of the grass courts, new floor and cupboards in the kitchen and a general updating of the Bar area will all be finished before Opening day.

Congratulations to John Turner arranged the complete a fully automatic installation of reticulation system covering twelve grass courts. The final cost is under \$7,000 and this has been financed by funds raised from our sponsors over the past three years. The Sponsorship committee set a goal in 1987 of reticulating the courts and it must give these members plus the sponsors great satisfaction to see it come to fruition. John Turner received great assistance from Craig Ellis and John Carroll plus several other members whilst carrying out this work.

The benefits will hopefully be visible during the summer months, as watering can now take place at the optimum time in the early hours of the morning, and supplementary waterings can be arranged during the hot weeks without the time consuming task of laying pipes.
