

We will be endeavouring to keep the grass courts in the new bay available as often as practical. Mark Watson has been asked to rganize the final top dressing of that bay in wo stages so that some play can be maintained, rather than closing the whole bay for a short time.

The South of the River Junior Tournament was a well run and successful event with the tournament committee and many club volunteers doing a splendid job.

Thanks to those members who attended the special meeting and took an interest in the future of the club. There was an excellent range of questions asked by those attending and the large majority voting in favour appeared satisfied that this move is one that is in the long term interests of the club.

The reconstruction of the clubhouse bay of three courts has now been completed with the grass being planted on Monday 13 May, three days ahead of the date scheduled. This should ensure that these courts will be available for play a lot earlier than we experienced last time.

SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING

This was attended by over 50 members and discussion took place on the desirability of replacing courts 6 - 8 with the new wintergreen grass. Costs of soil and cartage had gone up fairly substantially since doing the northern bay of 5 courts and some members felt we should do the four court bay opposite the Shed in this year. President Alec said the grounds committee had considered all aspects and particularly the need to inconvenience members as little as possible in this coming season. If approval was given at this meeting we would be ten weeks ahead of last years schedule and this together with the many lessons learnt in the establishment of the bottom bay would make things different this time. Difficulties with the reticulation and delays in regrassing bare areas had been addressed and it was felt that these courts would be available for play some weeks earlier in the coming season than the The condition of both first batch were. remaining bays was debated and although many thought courts 9 - 12 were worse than those of 6-8, it was not felt that there was much overall difference.

The motion to replace courts 6-8 was moved by Clem Overheu and was finally carried with approx 5 to 1 favouring this action.






