SOCIAL PLAY - Cec Gardiner

My thanks are extended to the many people who have helped in the creation of social play sets over the past two months. thanks also to those, who although unable to undertake their tasks on the roistered day, made arrangements for suitable replacements so the system was maintained. sporting club relies heavily upon responsible volunteers and it is pleasing that we have so many of these people within our membership.

In the survey conducted by the Club at the beginning of this season, a decisive majority indicated that they favoured the use of a computer system of compiling social sets, provided the faults and deficiencies it showed previously were successfully eliminated.

Mike Howes has provided the technical know-how that has allowed us to conduct a number of experiments with computer designed sets over the last two months. Although all sets played this season have been compiled manually by our roistered volunteers we have also been asking the computer to compile sets for comparative purposes. Copies of the computer compiled sets have been examined and analysed and then, after some consultation with various Club members, we have made some modifications to the computer program.

We now **think** we have a very satisfactory way of formulating social play sets. Consequently, we intend to use computer designed sets for each Saturday in January. While I realise that not everyone will be happy with any one way of arranging sets, I do hope everyone will begin with "an open mind", and where appropriate, will provide me with both positive and negative feedback.

As part of our Christmas Tennis Day on Saturday December 21, a tin and bottle tournament will be conducted. Each player is asked to bring a can or bottle worth one or two dollars (e.g. coke, baked beans etc.).

The results of each round of sets will see the ownership of the cans/bottles alter somewhat. By the end of the day you are unlikely to still own your can/bottle, but you may have acquired that of someone else.

Clever people may have gained three or four new cans/bottles, but some unlucky people may have lost their can/bottle forever. The size of your confidence (or ego) will be gauged by the size of the bag you bring to carry your "loot" home.
