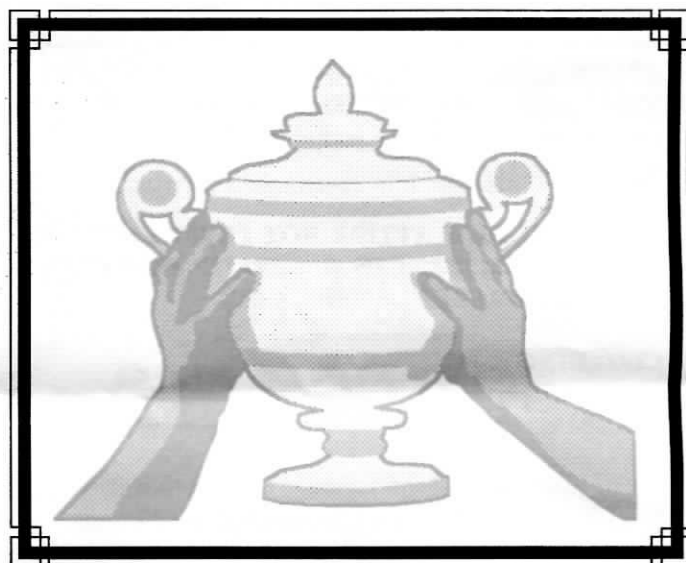

TENNIS ATTIRE

Hensman has attempted to establish a standard of dress acceptable whilst playing at or for the Club. Direction from Tennis West means it is no longer a request by our Board alone. The general belief is that standards statewide have slipped and firm guidelines been implemented to "maintain an appropriate standard of dress and decorum".

GENERAL STATEMENT

All clothing must be designed and manufactured as tennis clothing and must be clean and tidy in order to maintain an appropriate standard of dress and decorum.

MALES

Recognized, acceptable tennis shorts and shirts (colours permitted), white or cream trousers, cardigans, jumpers, pullovers. Shirts must have a collar.

FEMALES

Recognized, acceptable tennis dresses, skirts (divided or otherwise) and tops, shorts, cardigans, jumpers and pullovers.

TRACKSUITS

Tracksuits, leisure suit slacks or similar garments (colour or white) may be worn over tennis attire immediately before play. Tracksuit pants may be worn during the hit-up only. A tracksuit may only be worn as an adjunct to (not a substitute for) normal tennis attire. During cold weather and subject to the consent of an appropriate official, tracksuits may be worn during play.

FOOTWEAR

Must be designed and manufactured as tennis shoes appropriate for the surface pertinent to the particular event in which the player is competing.

UNACCEPTABLE ATTIRE NOT PERMITTED UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES & APPLICABLE TO BOTH MALE & FEMALE PLAYER

CLOTHING & FOOTWEAR

No sleeveless singlets, T-shirts, rugby tops, sweat tops, tank tops, and street attire.

No football, running or jogging, cycling, board, bermuda, boxer or walk shorts, swimwear, leotards, aerobic gear, stretch clothing, or body shorts worn under tennis shorts, leg warmers. No ripple sole, jogging, running, cricket shoes or shoes with raised heels or studs.

ADVERTISING

No bold lettering, writing or illustration designed as advertising or blatantly excessive and oversize commercial advertising.

We request that all members will comply with these guidelines and thank you in anticipation.

KNOW YOUR MEMBER

Dene Rundle

"Busy" is an apt description of DENE RUNDLE's life-style and certainly applies to his 25 years with Hensman.

Dene grew up in the small S.A. town of Paskeville, attended Adelaide's Prince Alfred College as a secondary student boarder before joining his father, step-mother and older twin brothers in Katanning in 1955. Breaking with the family farming tradition, he joined the ANZ bank where Frank Thomas (who seems to pop up everywhere) was also a staff member. Four years study by correspondence gave him his accounting qualifications and an opportunity with the statewide accounting firm, C.P. Bird. His initial posting was to Kalgoorlie for a period of 18 months, just long enough to play a lot of tennis and to be captivated by the attractive young June Blacker. The next few years were devoted to establishing a company branch at Quairading and maintaining a long range courtship with June. Happily this culminated in a 1963 wedding. His final assignment with Birds took him to Corrigin (Clem Overheu country) for a further 4 years.

In 1969 they mover to Perth when Dene set up a wholesale confectionary business in partnership with Brian Dinnie whom he had met in Corrigin. 12 busy years later they sold out to the Nestle company and Dene took off to India for a 6 week voluntary stint with the Institute of Cultural Affairs. Since then he ran a small publishing firm in Applecross before "retiring" to a part-time administration position with Farm Management Services.

During the whole of his country experience, Dene had shown a keen interest in tennis both on and off the court and since February 1970 Hensman Park has received the benefit of his considerable abilities and energy.

Dene became a committee member in 1971, Vice President in 1972, President for the next 3 years and has continued an active role in official and unofficial capacities ever since. Amongst his many accomplishments Dene set up a Club newsletter as fore-runner to the Herald, which he also edited from 1984 to 1993; established the bar facility; with Clem Overheu, formalised Club sponsorship; introduced changes to the Club constitution and administrative structure.

As a delegate to W.A.L.T.A. (Tennis West) he was drawn on to the executive committee, serving 3 years as shield match chairman, 6 years as treasurer and in 1993 was elected director metropolitan development.

His on court exploits have also been impressive. 2 Club men's doubles titles; runner-up to Doug Napier in the men's singles; member of Hensman A grade winning shield team. For the past 15 years he has been a member of the men's veterans 1st division side which has taken out several titles during that time.

Fortunately all members of the Rundle family have been actively involved with Hensman, otherwise they would have seen little of Dene over the years!

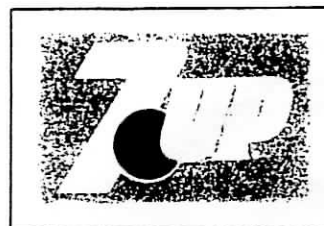
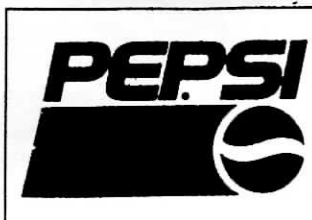
