


Keith Begley at full stretch during the semi final at Hensman

Born in Wangaratta (Vic) of Italian parents (although his surname is of Czechoslavakian origin!). He moved to Melbourne as a young child. His entry into tennis took place at the relatively late age of 14 and even then, only as a fill-in activity between soccer seasons. However he quickly adapted to the game, entered the junior competitive scene and at 17 won the Victorian Schoolboys Championships. In the same year he attained the Victorian No. 3 ranking in the under 18 age group.

On leaving school Mark spent 3 years on the Australian Satellite circuit, interspersed with part-time coaching jobs. In 1989 he lost a tournament final to Mark Kratzmann and the following year reached the final qualifying rounds for the Australian Open.

His move to Perth came about through a set of coincidental circumstances. Late in 1990 he was "enjoying" a short respite from competitive tennis and was looking for coaching opportunities. Meanwhile his brother, on a stay in Perth, had joined Keith Begley's Friday night group and mentioned Mark's interest. Keith followed up the lead and Hensman Park, as well as W.A. Tennis generally gained an exciting and popular new player.

Mark too, has no regrets; he describes himself as a converted sand groper, who loves Perth's wonderful life style - not the least our accessible beaches where he relaxes at every opportunity.

#### COURT REPLACEMENT PROGRAMME

A well attended general meeting on April 14th debated the options of replacing the existing synthetic grass courts with the same surface or an acrylic surface, and also whether to replace courts 9 - 12 this year.

Opinions of those in attendance were fairly evenly divided, with many preferring the synthetic grass to an acrylic surface, but acknowledging that the sandy surface was more prone to accidents than the acrylic.

The difficulties experienced and expense incurred this year with grass courts 9 and 10, and the number of complaints received by the captains and grounds sub-committee, made the deferral of this project seem little more than delaying the evil day.

The final vote favoured Option A, namely replacing the five synthetic courts with Chevron acrylic surface and proceeding on May 1 with the replacement of the bay of 4 grass courts with the new winter green grass.

Bert Wasley was a member for many years until ill health forced his retirement from the game a few years back.
