Warren Jones, fresh from the success at Newport was greeted warmly by members on his return to the Club recently and we wish him an enjoyable season of tennis.

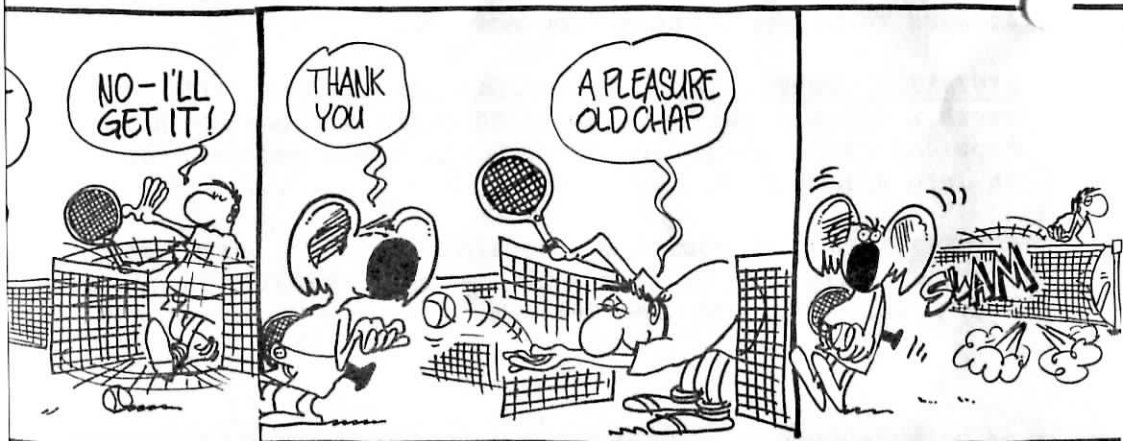
Kelly Bevan, our new hardworking Secretary, was chosen in this years State Basketball team.
