
At the end of the first round of fixtures our mid-week teams were in the following positions on the Premiership tables:-



SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR THIS YEAR

- 1. All Junior 16&U, 14&U and 12&U events will be run on weekends 2 and 3. Most matches will be scheduled in the mornings, from 9:00 am.
- Events 16 (XHD), 17 (XVD), 18 (M50LHD), 19 (L50LHD), 20 (X50LHD) and 21 (X18LHD) will be only played on weekends 2 & 3. Players may only enter 2 of these events. Only minimal exemptions will be granted for these events.
- 3. All other events will be conducted over all 3 weekends with finals on weekend 3. Finals for events with small numbers of entries **may** be on weekend 2.
- 4. Feed-in events (1F, 3F) will be played as part of the Mens and Ladies Championship Singles, entry is automatic and they will count as a second event.
- 5. Plate events may be organised in events with low numbers of entries. First round losers will go into a new draw and will play one 9 game Pro set.
- 6. All intending 1998/99 Tennis League players <u>should</u> enter Championship Singles events and the associated feed-in events if they wish to <u>improve or maintain</u> their position on the Club's Bumping Board. Results will be used to reassess the Bumping Board after the tournament.

NORMAL TOURNAMENT CONDITIONS

- 7. Ages to be taken on the first day of the tournament for underage and veteran events.
- 8. Play will commence at 9.00 am Saturdays (Juniors) and 12.30 pm Saturdays (Seniors) and 9.30 am on Sundays (All). Emergency matches (because of poor weather) may be scheduled for Saturday am or Wednesday and Thursday pm. Unfinished Saturday matches will recommence at 9.00 am Sunday where possible.
- 9. Only "unrestricted" financial members of the Club may participate.
- 10. The draw will be on display from Thursday (5.00 PM) before each weekend.
- 11. Players are required to report to the match office AT LEAST 10 MINUTES BEFORE THE DRAWN TIME of their match. The Tournament Referee has discretion to penalise players more than 10 minutes late by forfeiting them the first set 6-0 and if a further 20 minutes late, by forfeiting them the match.
- 12. Events with insufficient entries may be cancelled, format changed or amalgamated with another event at the discretion of the organising committee. Round Robins may be organised for events with a low number of entries.
- 13. Players may enter a maximum of <u>6</u> events with only <u>3</u> of these being Handicap Events. Events with feed-ins are counted as **2** events. Players left in **4** or more event events after the completion of the 2nd weekend may be asked to withdraw from some events if the Committee cannot devise a suitable schedule.
- 14. Championship events are the best of 3 tie-break sets.
- 15. Handicap events are the best of 3 sets 2 straight, the 3rd advantage.
- **16.** Handicaps may be adjusted at any time prior to the semi-finals. Handicaps will be set by the Tournament Committee. Note that plus and minus handicaps may be used.
- 17. For Handicap Events high ranked players should not nominate. (ie: above 5.0). The Tournament Committee may reject any such nominations
- 18. Events 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 may be split into two separate divisions (with separate finals) based on current Club NTRP grading (eg above and below 3.8).
- 19. Events 18, 19, 20, and 21 will be run as Lottery Handicap events. Do not enter with a partner, a partner will be drawn for you and then you will be handicapped.
- 20. The HARD COURTS will only be used when necessary.

EXEMPTIONS

<u>EXEMPTIONS</u> must be for <u>important</u> reasons and will only be granted at the <u>discretion</u> of the Tournament Committee. The maximum total number of hours exemption cannot exceed <u>10 hours</u>, over the 3 Weekends. Guidelines for requesting exemptions are:

- Players in Tennis League Finals on 14 & 15 March will be given automatic exemptions for the complete day and the hours will not be counted in the 10 hours.
- For doubles events your partners exemption requests must not be for times significantly different to yours.
- Exemption hours are calculated in the periods 12 to 6 Saturday and 9 to 6 Sunday.
- Exemption are unlikely to be granted for complete weekends if you enter in more than 2 events.
- You may only enter 4 events if requesting more than 4 hours exemption and only 3 events if requesting more than 6 hours exemption.


