GROUNDS

(Arnold Jones)

All the grass courts are in excellent condition at present. The big aim is to keep them in this state for the whole year. To do this we need to control spring dead spot so we are trialling a new spray programme which will start in April and require 2 or 3 follow-up sprays in the winter months.

We will also be experimenting with different line marking materials to make the lines more durable. At present, one heavy dew seems enough to erase them. One option is to use paint but this does not give a nice "puff of dust" when the ball hits the line. The other problem with paint is that it makes it difficult to shift court positions regularly which is very necessary to preserve the base line grass.

Several nets and centre tapes have been replaced recently.

Locking the hard courts seems to be working without too many hitches. I hope it is not keeping club members from having a hit during the week. It is necessary to stop non-members from having a free hit when the Pro shop is shut.

We may have to close the grass courts for a short period in August or September to enable grass renovation to be carried out adequately before the opening of the next season.

While the courts and weather are so good it would be great to see more members enjoying the excellent facilities we have.



(June Rundle)


The Chambers Women's Mid-week Tennis League has concluded and both our teams played off in the finals.


