




#### KNOW YOUR MEMBER

The late sixties will always be remembered with affection by that most affable of our members, Barry Daniel for it was in those years that he won our Club Championship three times. Barry is a left-hander and over the years his punishing forehand drives have taken their toll on many of his opponents. It was in 1966 at the tender age of 20 that Barry recalls the impact "professional tennis" had on tennis throughout Australia, with the rule that those in receipt of money from the game were not eligible to play in amateur club events or pennants — Barry hastens to add that his name appears on our Honour Board, thanks largely to that ruling which broke the run of Doug Napier who at that time was a professional coach. Barry went on to win again in 1968 and 1969.

During the week Barry practises dentistry and his cheerful outlook on life has been known to make even a trip to the dentist an event that "wasn't that bad, after all". After completing his studies Barry spent two years in Exmouth and then 18 months in Three Springs, followed by two years in Essex, ngland. It was during his time in England that the dream of seeing a Wimbledon final was realised for Barry. Accompanied by friend Lex Hardie, they sat in seats (at not inconsiderable expense) waiting for the players to come out, but instead the English weather played its hand and they sat through four hours of non-stop rain. Fortunately their seats were still valid for the following day when that match was finally played.

Barry and wife Dorothy have four children, and eldest son Dean is showing some of the enthusiasm for the game displayed by his Dad. Seeing the Demons win the 1955 grand final was one of the highlights of Barry's sporting memories, but he also recalls with pleasure winning the Men's Double Championship with Doc Stubley and taking out the Mixed Doubles with effervescent member, Joan Campbell.

Barry slipped quietly into the ranks of the veterans ast year and already he and Alan Stewart have ieir name on the Neil Gliddon Memorial Trophy for the Club's Veterans Doubles Championships. There's a lot of tennis left in Barry, and with his enthusiasm for the game lots of enjoyment for both he and his opponents in the years to come.
