

separately from "normal" Club finances. The necessary funds are raised by State Grade sponsorship and special events. This involves considerable effort obviously, support to the sponsors and team by all Club member is greatly appreciated.

The grass courts have held up well. Play has been possible throughout winter - weather permitting. Thanks to Kevin Fitzgerald and Jamie Chute. Special thanks to Craig Ellis for helping Jamie initially and for being a "stand by".

The efforts of Jamie with the gardens and the Monday maintenance gang of Kevin, Frank, Ross, John, Ken and Cliff must be mentioned.

Remember you can help maintain the courts and grounds to standard by observing court signs/instructions, disposing of rubbish, cans etc. Kevin and Jamie would appreciate any spare South Perth Council Tip passes from members, as disposal of grass clippings is a constant problem and expense.

The Board recently received a request to ban smoking in the Club hall. This is a complex issue involving members rights and it was not taken lightly. After considerable discussion it was resolved to request smokers to consider others and to smoke outside the hall wherever possible. I believe this already to be the situation and sincerely request the understanding and respect for others of both "sides" in this argument. The appropriate signage will be displayed.

Most would be aware of our grant application success. \$35,000 granted from the Ministry of Sport and Recreation, \$35,000 from the South Perth City Council, to be "matched" by \$35,000 of Club funds. \$105,000 approximately will be spent in renovations to the "facilities" end of the Club building, coaches area, public toilets and commencement of upgrading hard courts lighting (initially 2 courts). Thanks to the above mentioned authorities for acting favourably.

The renovations are about to commence. We had hoped that most could be completed during the winter season; unfortunately this was not possible because we would not commit the expense until we knew the final outcome of our application. There will be inconvenience, however by staging the work we hope to keep this to the minimum and keep facilities available. I am sure the final outcome will be worth the problems.

Future upgrading plans include improving fencing, re-roofing outside bar patio (essential), improving a paving and further hard court lighting upgrade.

I feel we can all look forward to an interesting and rewarding twelve months. I wish you and your families a great tennis year - both on and off the court.

Jan Spencer, wife of John, who is a member of the Hensman Park Tennis Club, has been writing her "gifts" for twelve months. Those who have met John will be aware that John and Jan have recently sold their farm at Dandaragan and moved to Como - (much closer to the Club!).

"Gift" was originally John's brainchild - when Jan was looking for a business opportunity which would allow her to make use of her degree in English and talent for writing. He suggested the concept of writing people's anecdotes and reminiscences for them, so that the precious memories belonging to the family will not be lost to future generations. NTRP RANKINGS

- (iii) physiotherapy which often involves ultrasound, interferential therapy, deep tissue massage and elbow and neck mobilisation, where necessary
