

#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Members,

# Tennis Tip "Shot Selection Strategy"

We know from our tennis experience that we often overplay some shots and at other times fail to capitalize on the easy shots. We sometimes attempt to hit returns of serve for outright winners off excellent fast serves. To become competent tennis players we must learn when we need to be defensive, when we need to be a little cautious and when we can afford to be more offensive with our play.

Shot selection may be summed up by using the TRAFFIC LIGHT ANALOGY. Every ball that is hit at us has a certain colour to it. Like the traffic light the ball is either Red, Orange or Green.

A RED BALL as the red traffic light suggests is one that says 'danger' of 'stop'. For example a cannon-ball first serve coming right for our head would be recognised as a red ball. When a red ball comes at us we need to neutralise it. We should be looking to 'block and bloop' it back rather than attempting to hit it back twice as fast.

An ORANGE BALL coming at us signals that we need to be 'cautious but we may proceed'. For example a ball hit wide to our backhand or perhaps to our low volley may be recognised as orange. Here we need to be conscious that our opponents have made us run, put us out of position, made us play from less than an ideal position. From here we need to remain calm and positive, fine tune our footwork and return the ball with purpose. We need to be cautious and not too offensive and yet not too defensive.

A GREEN BALL as the traffic light suggests would give us the 'go ahead'. With a green ball we can be more offensive. It is recognised as a ball that doesn't make us run too much and it is hit around thigh or waist hight. It would arrive where we feel most in control.

The colour of the ball is a personal decision dependent on:

- i) your ability level, and
- ii) your level of fitness

For example if we were playing Ivan Lendl or Steffi Graff every ball we hit to them they would set up as if it was an easy green ball, however, every shot that they hit us would be a difficult red one. Similarly, if we were playing a Sumo wrestler and we hit it straight to him at waist height he would recognise it as a green ball, however, if you hit it so that he had to take more than one step he would recognise it as bright red due to his lack of mobility.

My advice is to recognise your opponents weaknesses (technique, fitness, mental) as well as your own and develop a strategy around the TRAF-FIC LIGHT ANALOGY, that is to aim to give your opponent as many red and orange balls as you can so that you may receive as many green balls in return.
