

SUMMER TENNIS LEAGUE

Application forms for the Summer Tennis League season were sent out in early September with a closing date of 20 September 1994. The closing date was a little earlier than in previous years to allow sufficient time for the Tennis League Committee to organise challenge matches so that intending players (existing & new) can be slotted into the most appropriate team position. The first round of challenge matches will be held at the Club (or Wesley s College) on the weekend of 24/25 September. Details of challenge matches will be displayed on the Captain's room window on Thursday evening, 22 September (note: late tennis League applications will be considered up to 4 October 1994).

It is hoped to have Tennis League teams selected by Club Opening Day, 8 October with teams listed on the notice board. Final team positions, team divisions and fixtures will not be available from Tennis West until early November. Please keep your eye on the notice board.

Margaret Howman

Undoubtedly the most popular outcome of the recent Annual General Meeting was the election of MARGARET HOWMAN to the status of Life Member. It was fitting recognition of over 20 years of hard work and tireless service to Hensman.

Since joining with husband Bob in 1971, she has been continuously involved in a wide range of club activities. Apart from formal duties as a committee member for a number of years - 3 as ladies vice-captain and a long stint as afternoon tea supervisor, Margaret also applied her seemingly boundlessly energy to other less conspicuous areas such as clubhouse upkeep and security and attention visitors and new members. Occasionally her uncompromising approach may have raised a few eyebrows, but at no stage could her loyalty and dedication to Hensman Park ever be questioned. Probably, though, her most significant single contribution to the club was the setting up and organisation of ladies mid-week tennis.



priginally a Victoria Park girl, born, raised and schooled there, Margaret spent a period during the war and immediate post-war years in various parts of WA. In 1942 she embarked upon a nursing career, commencing her training at Woorooloo (at that time a large hospital for TB sufferers) followed by 12 months in Albany and then to Kalgoorlie. It was here she first met the dashing young Bob Howman during one of his visits home on army leave. Two years later, while Bob was based at Perth awaiting discharge, they organised a holiday in Albany where, aided and abetted by Margaret's sister decided upon a spur of the moment wedding, unaware that Bob was shortly to be sent to Albany when he resumed civilian employment with Australia Post. Meanwhile Margaret, who had been transferred to Bunbury hospital resigned her position to join her new husband.

Following the somewhat hectic but nevertheless romantic saga they settled down to a normal domestic life in Albany for the ensuing 5 years during which daughter Carol (now wife of MHR George Gear) was born and Margaret and Bob helped develop the Lawley Park Tennis Club.

Returning to Perth in 1951, they lived in Maylands for a short time before Margaret found herself back at Victoria Park. At his juncture Carrington Club's "Godfather" Norm Cunningham persuaded them to join them in the Southern Suburbs competition, where they remained until switching to Hensman. Their son Peter made up the Howman trio at the club and still retains active membership.







Some Famous Australians - You May Have Forgotten

In 1907 NORMAN BROOKES became the first Australian to win the Mens Singles Championship at Wimbledon. He was also in winning Davis Cup Teams. Recognized world wide as one of the greatest players of his time - France created him a CHEVALIER OF THE LEGION OF HONOR, Britain KNIGHTED him, and America presented him with the US GOLDEN RACQUET AWARD.

DAWN FRASER the only woman swimmer to win the same event, 100m freestyle sprint, in three consecutive Olympics, Melbourne 1956, Rome 1960 and Tokyo 1964, and many other gold medals. Too many World Records and Commonwealth Games wins to list made Dawn the greatest women swimmer in the world.



TENNIS ATTIRE

Hensman has attempted to establish a standard of dress acceptable whilst playing at or for the Club. Direction from Tennis West means it is no longer a request by our Board alone. The general belief is that standards statewide have slipped and firm guidelines been implemented to "maintain an appropriate standard of dress and decorum".

GENERAL STATEMENT

All clothing must be designed and manufactured as tennis clothing and must be clean and tidy in order to maintain an appropriate standard of dress and decorum.

MALES

Recognized, acceptable tennis shorts and shirts (colours permitted), white or cream trousers, cardigans, jumpers, pullovers. Shirts must have a collar.

FEMALES

cognized, acceptable tennis dresses, skirts (divided or otherwise) and tops, shorts, cardigans, jumpers and pullovers.

TRACKSUITS

Tracksuits, leisure suit slacks or similar garments (colour or white) may be worn over tennis attire immediately before play. Tracksuit pants may be worn during the hit-up only. A tracksuit may only be worn as an adjunct to (not a substitute for) normal tennis attire. During cold weather and subject to the consent of an appropriate official, tracksuits may be worn during play.

FOOTWEAR

Must be designed and manufactured as tennis shoes appropriate for the surface pertinent to the particular event in which the player is competing.

UNACCEPTABLE ATTIRE NOT PERMITTED UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES & APPLICABLE TO BOTH ALE & FEMALE PLAYER

CLOTHING & FOOTWEAR

No sleeveless singlets, T-shirts, rugby tops, sweat tops, tank tops, and street attire.

No football, running or jogging, cycling, board, bermuda, boxer or walk shorts, swimwear, leotards, aerobic gear, stretch clothing, or body shorts worn under tennis shorts, leg warmers. No ripple sole, jogging, running, cricket shoes or shoes with raised heels or studs.

ADVERTISING

No bold lettering, writing or illustration designed as advertising or blatantly excessive and oversize commercial advertising.
