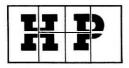

Members wishing to use courts between 7.00 p.m. and 10.00 p.m. are to book and pay hire fees to Keith Begley Tennis Academy.

Should members bring a visitor to play on the synthetic courts during the court hire periods, a fee is payable of \$2.00 per hour per non-member or the court hire fee whichever is the lesser. During Club times, of course, the \$3.00 visitors fee applies.

### OFFICIAL OPENING

There was a large attendance at the Club on November 22 for the official opening of our five new synthetic grass courts.

President Clem spoke of the tremendous amount of assistance received by the Club from the South Perth City Council and Department of Sport and Recreation, enabling us to undertake a project of this magnitude. The cost of \$130,000 was shared three ways and the Club had raised over \$20,000 in Debentures to enable us to meet our commitment. Many members had also given time and thought to ensuring that we came up with a viable and aesthetic synthetic court development. Club Patron and Mayor of South Perth, Mr George Burnett was unable to be present and expressed his deep regret at missing out on this occasion. His place was very suitably taken by Deputy Mayor Mr Les Aris, who complimented the club on this fine development and for the contribution it makes to the life of this city. He then officially declared the courts open. Vice President, Margaret Napier, took the opportunity to express thanks to President Clem for his mammoth contribution to this project, stating that few members had any idea of the incredible amount of time that Clem had spent following all aspects through and ensuring that it has turned out the success that it is today. This was greeted with acclamation by all present.

Good to see many of our Life Members present, including Clive Wilderspin and wife Enid, Eric Treasure and John Miller. Bruce Robinson and his wife Margaret were present for the opening and played several sets on the new synthetic courts. Bruce, who contracted the total project, appeared to be as relieved as President Clem to see everything completed. A number of South Perth City Councillors were in attendance (Mr Aris made mention of the five Councillor representatives from our Club who make such a fine contribution to our community) and Mr Phil Pendal M.L.C. was also present - Phil was very helpful in the early stages in making representations on our behalf to the Minister for our grant.

### Fitness plays its part

#### FITNESS FOR TENNIS

It can be said that any game of tennis is likely to tire both players, and the fitter of the two will not necessarily win. On the other hand, a superior strokemaker will often lose to an opponent possessing greater fitness and determination.

Research has shown that tennis is an ANAEROBIC game (short efforts followed by a rest period, i.e., 5 second rally followed by a 10 second rest prior to the next point) played on an AEROBIC base. The aerobic base is developed off-season by endurance running and then maintained throughout the playing season. The anaerobic energy systems (speed over repeated efforts) are trained during the pre and competitive seasons. Adequate muscular strength and endurance particularly in the lower limbs, abdominal, chest, lower back and upper limbs must be attained to help protect the body from injury and provide "penetration" or "power" to stroke production. Flexibility is another physical characteristic that must be trained in fitness for tennis. Stretching should be part of a player's total training programme to again help protect the body from injury while also allowing a full range of movements when stretching for a ball or suddenly changing direction. Sport science can therefore assist this aspect of tennis development by identifying strengths and weaknesses through testing programmes and then developing training regimes that will meet individual needs.

#### PSYCHOLOGICAL PREPARATION

How can a player maximise the level of performance in tennis, learn to play in the wind or accept the bad-bounce that will inevitably occur on a grass court? A player's ability to handle mental obstacles or stress often determines how successfully that player will perform.

Stress, which is often self-imposed, creates mental obstacles that elicit weak second services or miss-hit volleys in pressure situations. Simplistically stated, player improvements represent the integration of the body, mind and the environment.

Sport scientists address all of the above areas and try to provide players with an attitude to performance which will allow them to optimise their skill level. A positive attitude to performance or concentration can not be "switched on" but must be practiced as part of a training programme and used during the warm-up prior to a match. Realistic goals, a positive attitude to winning, self confidence, the ability to concentrate in a hostile environment or for long periods will only occur with practice.

Sport science as related in this paper is already an integral part of tennis development. Accredited coaches have been exposed to sports science as it relates to tennis, and the McDonalds Junior Development Programme has provided the opportunity for our squad players to attend training sessions both on and off the court.

#### KNOW YOUR MEMBER

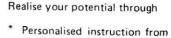
