

SYNTHETIC COURTS - A very well attended Special General Meeting was held at the Clubhouse on Sunday 10th March and many members expressed opinions about our Club proceeding to see if financially feasible arrangements can be made to convert our existing 17 grass courts to the new synthetic grass. When the vote was finally taken a big majority of those present were in favour of converting to the new surface.

A deputation from the Committee will meet the South Perth Council shortly and applications for grants from the Government will also be lodged.

CLUB HOUSE ALTERATIONS At the same meeting members were able to inspect the alternative plans for upgrading the clubhouse into more acceptable facilities for club members. The meeting voted in favour of spending \$25-27,000 on the second plan and this should greatly improve the smooth running of the Club, the afternoon tea area, the bar facilities and provide a proper area for Club memorabilia e.g. Shields, photos, honor boards etc. Further upgrading can be undertaken later as funds permit. President Clem again thanked member Alec Whyte for his excellent presentation of the plans to the members.

Grateful thanks are extended to Margaret Kingsbury for her dedication right throughout the season. The enjoyment generated amongst the younger ones plus the improvement in their play will be reward to Margaret for her efforts. 
#### On the competition scene
