GROUNDS AND HALL

The grass courts have now all been heavily verticut. The south bay looks very bare at present but we are hopeful that with some warmer weather and fertiliser the grass will be ready for some play on Opening Day.

With the wintergreen grass the thatch build up is tremendous. This is why the courts became so soft and spongy last season. There is hope that with the removal of all this (4 truckloads this year) that a hard even surface will result in a good even bounce again this year. The wintergreen grass is a prolithic grower - that is why it is greener all the year round- so our management techniques need to change to accommodate this. Regular verticutting will need to done twice yearly from now on.

A proposal to erect a wind break with sarlon cloth along the fence between each bay is being considered. Most of our tennis is played with a strong south westerly breeze blowing and it is felt tat a barrier such as this will considerably reduce the unpleasant affect on our tennis play. The Board has applied for a grant to help defray the cost of this. The club house and it's surrounds are all looking a little tired at present and need a spruce up so a small committee is investigating the best way of achieving this with minimal cost to the Club.

The rest of the hardcourts are to have a lighting upgrade to the standard of the existing levels on courts 4 & 5 so night tennis will be more feasible and enjoyable in the near future. We have received approval and financial assistance for this project and it should be under way in the next few weeks.

We are looking for volunteers for Monday morning general cleaning and bin emptying. At present Ross Totterdell does it all by himself and is getting lonely. Any offers of help please let Arnold Jones know, even if it only for a few weeks of the year.

We are delighted that **Kevin Fitzgerald** is continuing to be responsible for the hall bookings.

Thanks to **Frank Thomas** and **Ken Smith** for revarnishing the seats along the front of the clubhouse.
