PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The last couple of months have been full of activity with what many club members would regard as the highlight of the clubs tennis activities for the season.

The running of the Club Championship and Handicap Tournaments again proved to be generally very successful and to Captain's Lynnette and Cec, and to the new faces on the Tournament Committee this year in Nicole Pound and Ken McIntosh, go thanks for a difficult job well done, similarly to Colin for the junior events. Unfortunately, the tournament ran into "extra time" which was a direct result of the Veteran's Tennis Club tournament clashing with the dates provided by Tennis West in their calendar for clubs to run their club tournaments. This resulted in many unknown exemptions being requested on the final weekend which strictly speaking our tournament committee was not obliged to provide. It should be noted that there were several of our club members that didn't enter or only entered limited events at the Veterans because of this situation. At the Board meeting of 09/05/94 we resolved to put a notice of motion to the Tennis West Council for a directive to be issued to the Veterans Club for them not to run their tournament on the dates provided by Tennis West in the tennis calendar for club tournaments, which if successful will prevent this situation from reoccurring.

The 1st of May saw the running of the Ian Hutchison Real Estate Round Robin, where after 6 months of no rain Murphy's Law said it must rain, however history will show this not to be the case! On behalf of the club my sincere thanks go to Ian for his ongoing enthusiasm and support for this most popular of days, this years perhaps being the best ever. It was pleasing to get a full house without having to do a last minute ring around, unfortunately some entries had to be turned away. At this time I extend a vote of thanks to David Siglin for his efforts in organizing the event, to June and Dene Rundle who again made a significant contribution, and to Kim Siglin for what is without doubt the hardest job on the day in co-ordinating the kitchen. Also to everyone else who helped in varying capacities throughout the day, thank you also.

The annual dinner on 20 May will for many signal the end of the tennis season, and will see us pursuing our winter

interests, whilst our tennis racquets linger in mothballs at the back of cupboard, indeed this is the last edition of the *Hensman Herald* for 1993/94.

However, the new season will be on us before we know it, and it is now that consideration needs to be given to the 1994/95 season. It was with this in mind that I advised the Board of Management on 09/05/94 that I would not be standing for reelection as President for next season. Regretfully I have not committed the time that the position of President demands, and for personal reasons, with my wedding in June, impending changes in work commitments during the next 12 months, and a desire to spend more time on some of my other interests, this situation is unlikely to change. Therefore, I believe it is in the best interests of the club that I stand aside and allow a successor with the necessary time to tackle some of the issues which need to be addressed in the future.

I can look back over the last 2 years and see the introduction of the creche and the night tennis competition as being very positive initiatives that I believe the club should continue with and expand upon. Both of these are vital to the clubs long term future, the creche providing a service for young families to make coming to tennis much easier, and night tennis providing a greater utilization of club membership for the working person and those faced with working all day Saturday.

As the club has evolved over the years we have seen many changes, from the introduction of contract groundstaff, the introduction of the magnetic nametag sets system (anyone remember the old book method!), the renovation of the hall to clubrooms, to the installation of synthetic courts and lights with the resultant conversion to a 12 month of the year club, the replanting of all grass courts which further enhanced court availability, these have all been very positive developments for the club. Just as these have been beneficial in the past there will be need to be ongoing developments in the future to maintain Hensman Park as a leading tennis club and indeed keep tennis as a preferred sport in the face of all sorts of competition from other sports now available. In fact membership numbers within Tennis Australia affiliated tennis clubs has been in steady decline for several years, and several clubs in W.A. have reported significant decreases in membership this season.

We currently have a healthy number of children in the provisional junior group, but seem to have this large void between that group and the club proper, in fact we have only 4 junior girls (18 & under), of which 3 play State League, and 14 junior boys. One of the difficulties faced is that very few of the provisional juniors have parents who are club members, probably the strongest force which will tie the juniors to the club and have a situation whereby, at least temporarily, the club can not rely on this as a source of membership. We have had several children move through the club, but for one reason or another we fail to retain many of them for any period of time, therefore collectively we must work harder to encourage the juniors and integrate them into the club after graduating from provisional juniors, otherwise the considerable time and effort expended in this area is all in vain.

Additionally I see the improvement of the toilet and changeroom facilities as a pressing capital works project which needs to be addressed in the not too distant future. The clubhouse is now some 30 years old and these areas have rarely been touched other than a coat of paint.

I am also of the view that the "political hot potato" of the computerized set system needs again to be addressed, recognizing that previously we were a bit of a "guinea pig" and there were problems. Having relooked at our system a little during the season, I am of the view that the existing package, perhaps with a couple of minor modifications, or even another package (eg: South Perth's) can meet our requirements.

As the club has grown over the years, so to has the level of time and commitment required from it's voluntary workforce, and as such would submit that it is becoming increasingly difficult for the club to run entirely on a voluntary basis. The time of a paid "manager" to handle a lot of the day to day requirements, and free up the Board to concentrate on the important policy decisions may not be too many years away. It may also be appropriate to consider introducing 2 year terms of office for the Board, on a 50/50 basis so that at least 50% of the Board will remain in office after each election so that there is some assurance of continuity.

Having said much more than I intended, perhaps some of you out there may have similar or different thoughts, whichever it may be, I would like to ask every one of you to consider taking on some role in the clubs administration next year, be it as a Board of Management member, one of the sub-committees or helping on a regular basis on any of the various rosters.

The **ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING** will be held in August (date t.b.a.) at which time the election of office bearers takes place. It is possible that several of the current Board will not be standing for reelection, and therefore **"new blood" will be required**, and it would also be a healthy situation if there was an election or two for some of the positions. Please consider!

In closing I would ask that you please make a special effort to attend the AGM, as it really is an important part of the clubs administrative process.

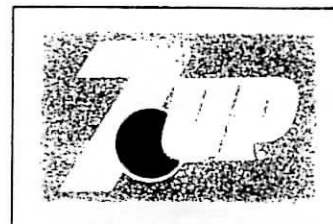
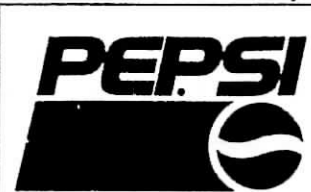

CAPTAINS ROOMS RENOVATIONS

Earlier this year the Board of Management approved plans for the renovations to the Captain's Rooms.

The purpose of this work is provide a suitable working office area for Board members, storage provision for filing of club records, appropriate storage area for tennis balls and an improved working environment for duty captains.

For many years club records have been passed from office bearer to office bearer and held at various homes, whilst tennis ball storage has also cluttered up the homes of many a club captain. Also the club membership database is maintained on the clubs computer and much of the administrative work is now done utilizing the word processing package.

It was therefore considered appropriate to renovate this area to provide the facilities that are now required. This work has now commenced and it is anticipated that it should be completed by the end of May. The budgeted cost of the proposed work is \$6000, the major part of this being for the cabinetwork which has been contracted to The Woodworkery (Sam Davy) who submitted the most competitive quotation.

Whilst work is in progress we expect that there will be only minimal inconvenience to club members.


