

CAPTAIN'S CORNER

With the pennant season very close to finals time, it is good to see that most teams have an excellent chance of competing in the finals and good prospects of a shield from a number of teams. This is despite a string of injuries and player problems experienced by numerous teams, however all the reserves called upon have more than adequately plugged the gaps.

Early in the season six teams on Saturday and four on Sunday were nominated to play at Trinity College as the home venue, however due to the lower than expected attendances for social play all Sunday teams and one Saturday team (on a rotation basis) have been recalled to play their home games on our synthetic grass courts.

Tennis Balls

Unfortunately with all the good things happening there are a few disappointing aspects that have to be addressed. TENNIS BALLS are disappearing at an alarming rate, and to date this season some 8 dozen have been lost. The committee is left with no option but to introduce a few measures to reduce these losses which include the following:—

 pennant team captains will be required to sign for their ball allocation, and a duty captain will sign for the return of same.

 during club play hours only club balls shall be used on the courts, and this shall be limited to two balls per court. (Sorry there will no longer be balls handed out to children.)

 any player who hits a ball over the fence shall endeavour to retrieve it at the end of the set. A replacement ball will be issued from the captain's room in the interim. (Always check if anyone is home before entering their yard.)

We reluctantly introduce these measures, however the unacceptably high losses of tennis balls must be stopped.

Captain's v. President's

This annual event for the Fitzgerald Cup will be conducted on SATURDAY 25th FEBRUARY. We would appreciate you making a SPECIAL EFFORT to get to tennis EARLY on this day, so play can get under way by 1.30 p.m. No entry fee but a good afternoon's tennis is assured.

Club Championship and Handicaps

These tournaments will be conducted over four weekends this year commencing on 11th March. As usual there will be NO social tennis on either the Saturday or Sunday of this first weekend (depending on entries). Entry forms will be out in the next few weeks, so get your ENTRY in EARLY (complete with entry fee money).

Bumping Board and Challenge Matches
All players are reminded that in order to
progress up the rankings you have to play
challenge matches. Rankings may also be altered at the discretion of the selection committee, subject to club championship results.

The rules governing challenges on the bumping board appear on the notice board in the Captain's room.

In part they read:-

"Any current players at the Club may not challenge at the start of the season. Challenges may be played from the 1st December until the closing date of the Club" (usually mid-June).

KNOW YOUR MEMBER

Carlo Silvio Pichetti was born in Trieste, Italy "some years ago" and spent the early years of his life in Rome where his Uncle and Auntie raised him. His parents had died when he was aged two and his father's brother immediately took Charles, as we now know him, under his wing. Educated at a very traditional Jesuit College in the heart of Rome, Charles remembers well being taught the etiquette of "duelling" and also of eating oranges with a knife and fork!

Charles was driving his Vespa around Rome in 1950 when he met up with an attractive young lady from Queensland, Australia. They became good friends and after she returned down under Charles had a hankering to visit this far away country! A couple of years passed and eventually his Auntie gave him a return air ticket to Australia and three hundred pounds (a lot of money at that time). The return ticket has never been used. His first business venture was a crocodile hunting expedition in the Northern Territory which got rid of most of his capital but not many crocodiles!

Charles headed to Queensland for the cane cutting season and then down south to Melbourne where he worked in the GMH research and testing division. In 1955 he came to Perth for the first time and actually studied at UWA for 2 years — English, Italian and Psychology. He married in 1959 and is the proud father of Danny, Michelle and Christopher.

He joined the Pyrox Company in Perth and became branch manager. In 1969 he was promoted to the position of Managing Director for Australia and was then based in Melbourne for the next 7 years. He lived near the Kooyong Tennis Club and had some interesting experiences as a Provisional Member of the ultra exclusive Australia Club in Melbourne. In 1980 Charles and his children returned to live in Perth, and shortly after he acquired his business known as "Canvass Fine Art" operating in Victoria Park.

Somewhere along the line Charles changed his name from the Italian delicacy sounding name to Pickett, and then last year his family gave him back his original and sentimental 'Pichetti' as a Christmas gift.

Hensman first became introduced to Charles in the early 1980s and it would be fair to say the Club hasn't been the same since! He has joined in the on court and off court activities with great enthusiasm. In appreciation of all Hensman has done for him, Charles is sponsoring the "Canvass Fine Art Mixed Classic" at the Club on Sunday afternoon, 26 February. Charles' only wish is that it be a FUN day.



Well with 1988 being the year for air fare increases both Domestic and International, we hope 1989 will see a lot more stability in the Tourist Industry.

Twelve months ago many of our members made a mental note of the talent shown by **Darren** in his quest for the City of Perth and W.A. Open Men's singles title, being staged at Hensman at the time. Two years ago Darren planned to shift to the city from his Geraldton home and board with his grandmother in Victoria Park, with Hensman in his sights as his tennis club. However he decided to become a boarder at Christchurch and for convenience joined the nearby Dalkeith Club at that time. With his schooling completed he joined Hensman at the beginning of this year and has already represented us in the State Grade with distinction.

Darren's recent success in winning the W.A. Men's Open Singles title is the culmination of a demanding preparation, which began ten weeks before Christmas when he played in the first of a series of eight Satellite tournaments in the Eastern States, starting at Cairns and finishing in Hobart. The tournaments have a 32 draw, however to get into the cut Darren had to play qualifying matches with 128 players vying for eight spots - he was successful in getting through these qualifying events and the experience gained in the main tournaments were obviously invaluable in his quest for the W.A. title which he won at Leederville so convincingly during the Christmas-New Year break. In February Darren will return to the Eastern States to compete in further satellite tournaments and then in April he is off to Europe for five months to gain further experience. We wish Darren the very best in his tennis career and in his time with our Club.

Visitors

The Committee is concerned that some members are not recognising THEIR RESPONSIBIL-ITY to pay fees (\$5 senior, \$2 junior) when they invite a visitor to the Club.

A visitor may only play at the Club THREE times in any one season. Visitors fees apply to club time on synthetic courts Monday to Friday and to grass courts, Wednesday, Thursday and weekends. Fees can be paid to Keith Begley's office when attended or fill in an envelope supplied in the box near the kitchen servery, and place it in the ball chute in the Captain's room.

Club members are allowed to play without charge on the synthetic courts during court hire times (provided they are not booked to other hirers) but must pay the appropriate to Keith Begley's office for visitors.

If you are unsure about club time and hire time on the synthetic courts, please refer to the sign on the fence adjacent to the courts which clearly shows the club hours.

Your fellow members rely on your honesty and integrity to ensure the privileges of YOUR club are not abused.

There will be a CRACKDOWN ON VISITORS FEES. All committee members will be on the lookout for non-paying visitors. The Pro Shop attendants will be cracking down also, and remember they can only identify you by your shoe tag. WILL YOU BE EMBARRASSED BY NOT WEARING YOUR SHOE TAG?
